1. What is this product?

Objectives

The product is designed to provide (1) a return in the form of fixed rate interest payments and (2) repayment of the **product notional amount** on the **maturity date**.

Termination on the maturity date: On the maturity date you will receive EUR 1,000.00.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the product and the issuer. The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until 2 January 2026. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 1 out of 7, which is the lowest risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a very low level and the potential for us to be unable to pay you any amounts due as very unlikely.

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 1 year
